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I have been using my natural fireplace for years, and it has always drafted well. I went to have my first fire of the season, and I had some smoke coming back into the house. Does this mean my chimney needs cleaning?

It might. It might be many things.

The biggest thing I hear out of this question is, "I went to have my first fire of the season..." Some people get excited about using their fireplace, and will try to have a fire when it is not that cold outside. And, this fall, we have had many days were it gets a little cold and then warms up. The house cannot keep up that quickly, which leads to the chimney having a hard time establishing that tornado effect you need to get the smoke vacuumed up the chimney.

I typically tell people that many houses cannot have a fire in the fireplace unless it is below 40 degrees outside for at least 24 hours. If you go to have a fire then and it is not drafting well after years of it working fine, something else is going on.



Update on DSPS Proposed Rule Changes

In my October column, I reported that the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) was working with a few legislators to draft a "clean up" bill for a number of regulated professions to make minor, technical changes in State Law.

This legislation was introduced in mid-October by Senator Frank Lasee (R-De Pere) and Representative Dale Kooyenga (R-Brookfield) and referred to legislative committees in both houses. One of the provisions of Assembly Bill 433 and Senate Bill 345 is a change to the continuing education requirement for home inspectors to 40 hours every 2 years instead of the current requirement of 20 hours per year. DSPS wants the continuing education

requirement to coincide with the requirement that home inspectors register with the Department every two years.

A public hearing on SB 345 has been held and we will continue to monitor both bills – and all other legislation pending before the Legislature – for its affect on home inspectors.

Rule Changes

DSPS has notified me that once the "clean up" legislation is passed and signed into law in early 2014, the Department will propose changes to the Administrative Rules related to home inspector regulation:

- Change the administrative rule to reflect the new statute pertaining to continuing education requirements - 40 hours of continuing education every 2 years.
- Change the administrative rule to match the statutory renewal date for home inspector registration. Currently, the rule states the renewal date for home inspectors is January 1 of each odd-numbered year. The State Statutes currently set the renewal date as December 15 of each even-numbered year.

In addition, I have learned that DSPS is looking at other changes to the administrative rules pertaining to how continuing education credits can be earned by home inspectors. A very rough draft of a rule proposal was shared with Swandby/Kilgore Associates, Inc. and I forwarded it to the WAHI Board. The Board reviewed the rule draft and has a few questions and concerns.

I am in the process of scheduling a meeting with key Department leadership and staff to get answers to WAHI's questions. When I know more, the information will be shared with WAHI leadership and members.

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

Education House – Inspection Review and Training Friday, December 6th, 2013

This on-site inspection event is comprised of two parts – an inspection *review* in the morning, followed by inspection *training* in the afternoon. WAHI has obtained the use of a home in the Oconomowoc area for this program.

Inspection Review

This peer review event is an opportunity for you to evaluate and refine your inspection skills with the aid of a panel of your peers, rather than a person in a black robe with a big "hammer" (i.e. gavel). Results will be kept strictly confidential.

Participants will have two-hours to complete their inspection (electrical panels will already be removed, ladders in place, cover off the furnace, etc., to aid in the time limit). Upon completion participants will present their findings and their completed report to the panel as if to a client – the panel have inspected the house and identified defects. Participants are asked to bring two recently completed inspection reports for review by the panel to see if they are meeting state standards. There will be "must find, must report" items that the panel will be looking for. The panel will be focusing on the identification of major defects, not issues such as windows or doors sticking. During the inspection process communication between participants will not be allowed as this event is intended to help participants evaluate their <u>personal</u> skill level. The morning session will be worth **three continuing education credits** and is limited to the first 10 registrants.

Inspection Training

The afternoon session will be inspection training at the same property. Experienced experts will be posted throughout the house in numerous locations to provide approximately 45-minute presentations on how to inspect various components, focusing on the WI Standards of Practice. Participants will then rotate to the next area/presenter. The training will take place from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm and will be worth **four continuing education credits**. The afternoon portion will be limited to the first 40 registrants.

WAHI Member cost to attend this event is as follows: Educational Review (morning) - \$75.00 Inspection Training (afternoon) - \$60.00 Review <u>and</u> Training (all day) - \$135.00 Non-members, add \$30.00 to the fees stated

All participants must preregister as space is limited – no on-site registrations. All participants will be notified by a member of the Education House Committee with the specific location. Lunch break from 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm for all day participants - on own.
