From the President: October Updates



The WAHI Board of Directors is still engaged in understanding the fallout from the state's audit of home inspectors' continuing education. In this month's issue you will hear directly from Kilgore/Swandby and Associates with the results from the state audit committee. It appears that a significant number of state licensed inspectors are not in compliance with the requirements. Please read Kathy Kilgore's letter for the complete scoop on this topic.

In better news, your Education Committee is hard at work putting together speakers for what will be another outstanding Fall Seminar on December 6-7. I'm excited about the educational topics to be presented, and we will have great information for all levels of experience and knowledge. The venue this year is the Olympia Resort, Spa and Conference Center in Oconomowoc. This is a resort complex with venues suitable for all ages, so you might consider bringing the whole family for a nice weekend.

We have also set the schedule for the Infra-Red Buildings Application Training (Level 1), February 4-7. Infra-Red Buildings Application Training (Level 1) February 4-7, Baraboo, WI

PURPOSE

The purpose of this training is to provide handson applications instruction in the use of thermo graphic imaging equipment. These on-site training courses will focus on those applications relevant to the inspection needs of target audience, especially thermographers working with homes and buildings for inspections and energy audit as well as those who are exploring the technology.

While owning infrared equipment is not necessary, there are several hands-on simulations and exercises in the course and participants are encouraged, if they have a camera, to bring it to the course. The participants, upon completion of the training, will have an understanding of the basic heat theory necessary for thermal work, will know how to best utilize the imaging equipment you have, and will be better able to employ the equipment to perform surveys.

Completion of this course prepares participants to more fully apply the technology to both residential and commercial building applications including insulation, air leakage and moisture issues as well as inspections of commercial roof, electrical and mechanical systems.

FORMAT

The training will consist of classroom lectures, group discussions, demonstrations and fieldwork (when applicable) for a group of up to 25 people. Materials prepared especially for instruction in building application thermography will be used. Hands-on activities are emphasized so that participants use the equipment during a large portion of the training. Comprehensive training manuals, for use during and after the course, are included for each participant.

POST-COURSE SUPPORT

The Snell Group provides post-course support to all graduates of our training courses. This can take many forms. Specifically included in the cost of this proposal are the following:

The specific exam will be based on either your written procedures or on accepted ASTM, ISO, NFPA, NETA, IEEE, OSHA, EPRI, and BINDT methodologies. The practical exam will allow you to prove you have the skills necessary to perform testing in the field. In the absence of having written procedures, each student will be given a copy of the applicable standard that applies to your work.

You will also leave with a copy of a Written Practice. A Written Practice is a suggested guideline on how to organize and manage a certification program for your company. It is a straight forward document and process to set up a program, but it has critical importance in describing the educational experience and testing requirements for certification for your organization. As part of the course fee we will help you after the course to put in place a meaningful and effective written practice.

Legislative Focus: DSPS Busy With Audit, Bill Drafting, Rule Changes

As many of you are probably aware from past newsletter articles, the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) has conducted a continuing education (CE) audit. The audit has been completed and our contact at DSPS referred to it as "eye opening." After hearing the results of the audit, "eye opening" is not a good thing.

Only 37% of registered home inspectors are in compliance with the continuing education requirements. When you factor in the home inspectors who have 40 hours of CE in two years, but failed to meet the 20 hours in one year requirement, compliance is 55%.

We were told DSPS will not pursue discipline against home inspectors who were out of compliance due to 40 hours in two years vs. 20 hours per year. However, the 45% who are out of compliance for other reasons will be turned over to DSPS's Division of Legal Services and Compliance for disciplinary action.

DSPS is also working with a few legislators to draft a "clean up" bill for a number of regulated professions to make minor technical changes. One of the changes that will be included in the bill is a provision to change the continuing education requirement for home inspectors to 40 hours every 2 years rather than 20 hours per year. DSPS wants the continuing education requirement to match the registration terms.

The bill is likely to be introduced in late September or early October. DSPS hopes it will move quickly through the Legislature. We will be watching for the bill and will keep the WAHI Board informed of its progress. Once the bill is passed later this year or early next year, DSPS will propose Administrative Rule changes to do two things:

- Change the administrative rule to reflect the new statute pertaining to continuing education requirements – 40 hours of continuing education every 2 years.
- Change the administrative rule to match the statutory renewal date for home inspector registration. Currently, the rule states that the renewal date for home inspectors is January 1 of each odd-numbered year. The State Statutes state that the renewal date is December 15 of each even-numbered year.

We will be monitoring the rule drafting and introduction because DSPS could attempt to insert additional items into the rule change to "fix" any issues it may have discovered during the CE audit.



Education House – Inspection Review and Training Friday, December 6th, 2013

This on-site inspection event is comprised of two parts – an inspection *review* in the morning, followed by inspection *training* in the afternoon. WAHI has obtained the use of a home in the Oconomowoc area for this program.

Inspection Review

This peer review event is an opportunity for you to evaluate and refine your inspection skills with the aid of a panel of your peers, rather than a person in a black robe with a big "hammer" (i.e. gavel). Results will be kept strictly confidential.

Participants will have two-hours to complete their inspection (electrical panels will already be removed, ladders in place, cover off the furnace, etc., to aid in the time limit). Upon completion participants will present their findings and their completed report to the panel as if to a client – the panel have inspected the house and identified defects. Participants are asked to bring two recently completed inspection reports for review by the panel to see if they are meeting state standards. There will be "must find, must report" items that the panel will be looking for. The panel will be focusing on the identification of major defects, not issues such as windows or doors sticking. During the inspection process communication between participants will not be allowed as this event is intended to help participants evaluate their <u>personal</u> skill level. The morning session will be worth **three continuing education credits** and is limited to the first 10 registrants.

Inspection Training

The afternoon session will be inspection training at the same property. Experienced experts will be posted throughout the house in numerous locations to provide approximately 45-minute presentations on how to inspect various components, focusing on the WI Standards of Practice. Participants will then rotate to the next area/presenter. The training will take place from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm and will be worth **four continuing education credits**. The afternoon portion will be limited to the first 40 registrants.

WAHI Member cost to attend this event is as follows: Educational Review (morning) - \$75.00 Inspection Training (afternoon) - \$60.00 Review <u>and</u> Training (all day) - \$135.00 Non-members, add \$30.00 to the fees stated

All participants must preregister as space is limited – no on-site registrations.
